



FIXED ROUTE & ADA OPERATING EXPENSES



FIXED ROUTE & ADA OPERATING FUNDS & SUBSIDIES






FIXED ROUTE & ADA HIGHLIGHTS


- Launched the Freedom Transit mobile app that allows riders to purchase, manage, and redeem digital bus passes, plan their ride using the trip planner tool, and view real-time bus arrival information. Riders could also opt to use a Freedom Transit smartcard in place of or synced to the mobile app to pay for transit fare. Senior riders were given smart cards to allow for better ridership tracking in this fare category.
- Five new bus shelters were erected along our bus routes in Washington and Canonsburg areas. The new bus shelter locations include Crumrine Tower, Pathways along Jefferson Avenue, Beau Street Park & Ride, Southpointe Park & Ride, and Valley View Terrace. Each bus shelter was equipped with a bench, side panels to protect riders from wind and the elements, and a solar light.
- The Prexie Pass laid way for the Freedom Transit student pass to launch, allowing other school districts to participate in the discounted transit fare card for fixed route service. The 30-day bus pass sells for \$10 and is available to students 12-17 years of age.
